Homecoming Theme

In 1956, KU introduced Homecoming themes. Themes are utilized to create a consistent concept to be used throughout Homecoming week on participating entries for events. The first official theme was "Songs of Victory." The theme is annually selected by the Homecoming Steering Committee, and the 2023 Homecoming theme is *"Rah Rah Jayhawk"* designed to celebrate the origin of the famous Rock Chalk chant and embody the Jayhawk traditions and spirit. In celebration of the 111th Homecoming at the University of Kansas and the 100th anniversary of the 1923 Jayhawk, the theme pays tribute to the long-lasting connections and achievements Jayhawks have made throughout KU's history.

Competition Format

Who Can Sign Up:

For Homecoming 2023, all student organizations will be able to sign up to participate in the week's activities. Using this <u>registration link</u>, students can register by <u>October 13, 2023, by 5:00 p.m.</u> for individual events or for the overall competition. Individuals or groups wanting to create a chalk drawing for Chalk N' Rock, perform a talent at Jingles, or make a sign, but not compete in each event can sign up only for the events they are participating in. Groups that would like to be a part of the overall competition will sign up as a large group/organization (101-600 members) or a small group/organization (0-100 members). Partnering will be allowed for both small and large organizations, though there are guidelines for these partnerships below.

Partnering Guidelines:

- - ✓ Organizations are required to indicate whether they are a Small Group or Large Group when registering for the competition.
 - Regardless if your organization is competing alone or with another organization, organization(s) within the Small Group Category cannot exceed more than 100 members, and organization(s) within the Large Group Category must exceed 100 members, but not exceed 600 members.
- When awarding first, second, and third place, all organizations will receive a trophy or plaque in recognition of their achievements (including each organization within a Competition Group).
- ∉ The cash prize awarded from first, second, and third place will be split amongst each organization within a Competition Group. If an organization is competing alone, they will receive the lump sum.

Event Description: Chalk N' Rock is a signature Homecoming event that offers a sidewalk chalk competition that invites student organizations and individual students to engage in chalk drawing on Wescoe Beach as an engagement activity to display school KU spirit and Jayhawk pride by incorporating the annual Homecoming theme. Participating groups and individuals will be given a pre-assigned square on Wescoe Beach where they will have from 10 am to 2 pm to chalk a design following this year's theme, Rah Rah Jayhawk. Each group will be provided with the same amount of chalk which the Homecoming Steering Committee will provide to groups on the day of the event. Everyone participating will be judged according to the criteria below. Every group or individual is eligible to receive a superlative, and those competing in the week-long competition will receive bonus points for each superlative awarded. Fan Favorite voting will take place on social media. The following categories and criteria outlined are what competition participants will be evaluated based on as a reference.

<u>Event Description:</u> Jayhawk Jingles is an annual KU tradition where groups create and perform skits that incorporate the overall homecoming theme and KU. These skits will be original performances that will be performed for a live audience the night of the show.

Performance Rules and Guidelines:

- Jayhawk Jingles is open to all KU students and organizations.
- All participants must be KU students.
- There are three categories for performances:
 - o Individual acts
 - Small group acts
 - Large group acts (50+ members)

If your performance represents your organization, you will be judged in the category based on your organization's membership size, not the number of performers in the act

- Every performance must be appropriate for family viewing.
- Words and actions throughout the performance are to be appropriate.
 - o If a performance is unsatisfactory, the performance will be:
 - Disqualified
 - Not be judged.
- The participation limit is 50 members of the organization.
- Individuals performing talent acts have a maximum time limit of 3 minutes.
- Small and Large group acts have a maximum time limit of 5 minutes.
- Each performance may use as many songs as you desire but cannot run over the maximum time limit.
- Musical tracks must be lyrical versions only.
 - Use of tracks containing words will result in a 10-point deduction.
- Acts cannot pay for assistance on their rehearsals, arrangements, coaching direction, composition, or performance writing. Failure to comply will result in disqualification. If two groups turn in similar performances, it shall be on a first come, first-serve basis as determined by the Homecoming Steering Committee.
- Budgets (money is not provided, but is the responsibility of those performing should they decide to spend money on supplies for performance)
 - o Individual and small group acts can spend no more than \$200.
 - Large group acts can spend no more than \$300.
 - Copies of receipts used on supplies will be collected via email from groups by the HC Steering Committee

Judges:

The Homecoming Steering Committee will select judges.

- Judges will remain anonymous until the night of the performance.
- Every effort will be made to select impartial judges with no affiliation with the participating groups.
- Judges' decisions and accountants' tally announce will be final.
- They will not be subject to an appeal or available for review at any time.

Award Description: In conjunction with the Student Union Activities, the Student Involvement & Leadership Center, and the Board of Class Officers, the Homecoming Steering Committee will select and honor two KU students with the annual Ex.C.E.L. Award for Excellence Community, Education, and Leadership. These two students will be chosen based on their capacity for leadership, effective communication skills, involvement in the KU community, academic scholarship, and their ability to interact and work with a wide variety of students and organizations. The selected recipients of the Ex.C.E.L. Award will also each receive a cash gift from the Board of Class Officers and the KU Alumni Association. All applications will be screened, and finalists will be selected to interview with the Ex.C.E.L. Award Selection Committee, comprised of students, faculty, staff, and administrators from various University departments. The Ex.C.E.L. Award finalists are presented and recognized during Homecoming Week.

Eligibility and Selection Criteria:

- Applicants must be enrolled as full-time University of Kansas undergraduate students. during the 2023-2024 academic year and have a minimum of 60 total credit hours.
- Applicants must have maintained a cumulative GPA equal to or greater than 3.0.
- Applicants must submit an application, supply one reference, a personal statement, and a résumé or CV.
 - The reference form must be a KU faculty, staff, administrator, or representative of a community service agency.
- Past Ex.C.E.L. winners are not eligible to apply for the award.
- Winners are awarded a \$250 stipend, award plaque, and recognition at the Football games and throughout the HC week at various events.

Application Process:

Students interested in applying for the award must submit:

- Online application
- Personal Statement
- Résumé/CV
- Name and contact information for one reference

<u>Interviews:</u> Upon notification that a candidate is a finalist, interviews will take place during the week of **Oct. 2-6**th, in a hybrid format. Finalists will be required to participate in a 30-minute interview during this time.

Award Description: In her 13 years at the University of Kansas Alumni Association, Jennifer Alderdice motivated countless students to become involved and take pride in the University. As assistant vice president, she organized hundreds of events for the Student Alumni Association and the KU community. Jen's motivation and dedication to our university are inspiring, and those who possess her attributes should be recognized. The 2009 Homecoming Steering Committee created this award to honor Jen, a longtime Steering Committee advisor. Jen left the Alumni Association after she and her husband adopted a baby in 2009. The winner of the Jennifer Alderdice Homecoming Award will be selected based on outstanding dedication, initiative, motivation, positive attitude, and contributions to KU — in other words, the Jayhawk who best

emulates the qualities of Jen Alderdice. The winner will be recognized during Homecoming Week and will be selected by the Homecoming Steering Committee. Past recipients are listed online at homecoming.ku.edu.

Eligibility and Selection Criteria:

- Applicants must be a full-time sophomore or junior students with an overall grade-point. average of 3.0 or higher.
- Applicants must be presently active in the KU community.
